- Learning and memory problems, including dementia and poor school performance.
- Mental health problems, including depression and anxiety.
- Social problems, including family problems, job-related problems, and unemployment.
- Alcohol use disorders, or alcohol dependence

- Continuing cocaine use despite mounting problems the drug is causing
- Neglecting responsibilities at work or school
- Abnormal heart rhythms
- Constriction of blood vessels
- Chronically runny nose
- Nosebleeds
- Nasal perforation
- Hoarseness
- Increase in body temperature
- Increase in heart rate
- Increase in blood pressure

- Decreased appetite

- Increased heart rate and blood pressure

- Much of the person's time spent seeking or using the drug
- Missing pills from a prescription
