

WisDOT is accepting applications for projects outside the Madison urban area. The MPO will score and select projects with its allocation of STBG-TA funding using its adopted program policies and scoring criteria, available at the bottom of the TIP page on the MPO website. STBG-TA funding can be used for capital projects improving non-motorized transportation networks, transit stops, improving intermodal connectivity, Safe Routes to School planning and programming (non-infrastructure), and ADA Transition Plans for public Rights-of-Way (non-infrastructure). See the MPO's program policies (link above) for a list of eligible project types. The MPO coordinates and approves the projects for funding, but the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) administers the program for the MPO. Only projects located within the Madison urban area boundary are eligible for STBG-TA funding through the MPO.

Applications for funding for non-infrastructure projects (Safe Routes to Schools planning and programming, and ADA Transition Planning) are
