










In a typical year, how many days do you walk or wheelchair a few blocks or more?

- 104+ days - Two days a week or more on average


In a typical year, how many days do you ride a regular (non-electric) bike or trike?

- 104+ days - Two days a week or more on average






Do you walk or wheelchair a few blocks or more? By Highest Level of College or School Completed




Do you ride a regular (non-electric) bike or trike? By Highest Level of College or School Completed
