Current condition of the courts: history / maintenance

- Originally constructed in 1976 (west set) and 1981 (east)
- Both sides were reconstructed (mill/overlay) in 1990
- Each side has received 6 rounds of crack fill/resurfacing
- Maintenance work earns "diminishing returns"
- Court lighting added to west courts in 2014



Current condition of the courts: supporting infrastructure

- Fencing is original and in "okay" to "poor" condition
- Openings in fence are "maze" style/not ADA compliant
- No accessible route of travel from sidewalk/r.o.w. area
- Pavement connections to main shelter / restroom facilities is "poor" PASER rating <5
- Since 2014, LED fixtures are more widely available and lower cost to purchase and operate






Proposed Tennis Reconstruction

Courts will be demolished & rebuilt in existing footprint

- West courts proposed for reconstruction in 2022; east courts proposed for reconstruction in 2024
- Fence proposed to be rebuilt to shorter (10' height) which is current standard
- Courts will be dual-striped for pickleball (blue lines) and tennis (white lines) play
- Lighting will be added to east courts

- Input from this meeting will be shared with Parks leadership staff
- Parks will be bidding the project to construct the west courts in early summer 2022
- Existing (west) tennis courts to be demolished in late summer 2022
