PART 6 - WAIVER: The Plan Commission may waive the requirement to provide inclusionary dwelling units in the development if the applicant can present clear and convincing financial evidence that providing the required number of inclusionary dwelling units on-site renders providing the required number of inclusionary units financially infeasible. In such a case, a developer may request a waiver to provide the units off-site, assign the obligation to provide the units to another party, or pay cash in lieu of the units, or any combination of the above. If the waiver is granted, the required units may be provided as new construction off-site in another development within **one mile** of the subject development; off-site units shall be provided at least 1.25 times the number of units if provided within the subject development. Off-site units must be constructed within one year of the time that they would have been constructed within the subject development. The applicant may opt to pay money into the based on contribution rates established in Section 28.04 (25) of the Zoning Ordinance. If provision of the inclusionary dwelling units through the waiver is still financially infeasible, the developer may seek a reduction in the percent of units to the point where the project becomes financially feasible. If such a waiver is requested, a detailed explanation shall be provided in the required project narrative demonstrating the financial infeasibility of complying with the ordinance requirements and the rationale for the alternative proposed.
