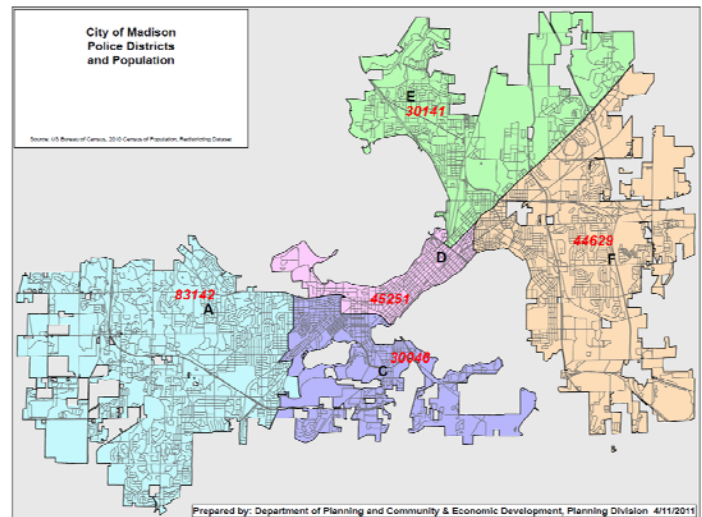




MPD Midtown Station Facts

Current West District:

- Serves a population of 83,000+ (about 1/3 of the City)
- Covers about 28 square miles (about 1/3 of the City)
- 330 miles of roadway/60 parks/17 public schools
- District station was built in 2001 for 58 employees; currently 90+ employees work out of the building
- Would be the 5th largest City in the State of Wisconsin



How will a Midtown Station help?

- Most MPD services are decentralized

- Smaller area/population served = better service
- Improved capacity for community policing
- More proactive initiatives
- More problem solving capacity
- Increased visibility
- Increased efficiency (less travel time)
- Improved services delivered from Midtown Community Policing Team; Neighborhood Resource Officer; Mental Health Officer & Gang Officer (currently these officers assigned West have more residents per position than other districts)

Why Not Just Re-district?

- Not enough space—all MPD facilities other than East District are at/above capacity
- Town of Madison Annexation and future growth to the West of the City will create additional space needs
- City geography limits options
- Does not address level of service delivered
