Types of Force Used By Officers

From April 1st through June 30th of 2016, Madison Police Officers responded to 55,999 calls for service. In that time, there were 58 citizen contacts in which officers used some kind of force during their encounter. This means that in the 2nd quarter, MPD officers used force 0.10% of the time when engaging with our citizens. Each of these force incidents documented by officers was reviewed and determined to be within MPD standard operating procedures.
