

Types of Force Used By Officers

From January 1st through March 31st of 2017, Madison Police Officers responded to 32,071 calls for service. In that time, there were 42 citizen contacts in which officers used some kind of force during their encounter. This means that in the 1st quarter, MPD officers used force 0.13% of the time when engaging with our citizens. Each of these force incidents documented by officers was reviewed for compliance with MPD standard operating procedures.
