Other Collaborations

 According to the MPD MARI Coordinator, MPD responded to 259 "Overdose" calls in 2017; 55 % increase from 2016.

 For 2018, MPD has responded to 144 "Overdose" calls; 64 of these calls have been just in the months of May and June.

 MPD also advises they have investigated **16 overdose deaths** in the City of Madison since May 1st, 2018.

MPD Overdose Call for Service Trend:

- 2017 = 255
- 2018 = 274
- 2019 = 78 (Jan-May)

<u>Chief Koval Blog Post: Overdose Data</u>

- 28 % decreases in overdose calls from Jan-May 2019 compared to same period in 2018.
 - 52 males; 26 females
 - 64 white; 10 African American; 4 other (H, A, NA)
- 13 overdose fatalities Jan-May 2019:
 - 10 males; 3 females
 - 9 white; 3 African American; 1 Asian.

2018-19 MPD Overdose Data



- MARI is based on successful initiatives in other cities that have led to ↓ overdoses, ↑ addiction treatment, ↓ crime recidivism.
- Pre Arrest Diversion Program
 If participant successfully completes it, charges are not filed, reducing the longterm impact of a criminal record on college and scholarship applications, housing, employment, etc.

468 overdoses since MARI started74 fatalities

>218 MARI referrals completed by MPD

>41 adults completed MARI program

>27 are currently in MARI

40 MARI participants were "discharged unsuccessfully" (33 - charges referred to DA Office; 7 - referred to Municipal Court)

All 440 Madison 'street patrol' police officers were trained

Analyzed period: 174 referrals

124 eligible individuals

79 completed addiction assessment:

65% men; 90% White, 8% Black; 35 ± 10 years old

79 completed addiction assessment:





79 adults completed the assessment: 25 discharged (baseline data only)

37 completers (pre- & post-MARI data)
