OFFICER NARRATIVE:

On 3/31/2013 at 4:37 pm, in full military-style Madison Police uniform, and acting in my official capacity as a City of Madison police officer, I was dispatched to 1125 Williamson Street in reference to a check person. The caller, who was later identified over the phone verbally as Max J. Schneidewend, had called saying that the person staying at his apartment located at Williamson Street had sent Schneidewend a letter with very paranoid writing saying he had to leave. Schneidewend advised Dispatch he had a friend go over to the apartment to check the tenant's welfare, and the friend found damage to the outside door and a new lock on Schneidewend's apartment door as well as a foul odor. Schneidewend advised that his house sitter or the male staying at his apartment while he is in San Francisco is a Gary Overby who is a male white, 45 years old, and works for Green Cab. It was also unknown if Gary was still there and his cell phone was off.

Contact with Wyatt B. Agard:

Upon my arrival, I contacted Wyatt B. Agard who verbally identified himself to me. Agard stated he is the friend and used to live at Williamson Street with Schneidewend. Agard stated Schneidewend advised him to check on who was identified as Gary J. Overby. Agard said he went to check and he noticed the outside door that goes into the stairs up to Schneidewend's and Overby's apartment had been damaged and some of the wood from the frame looked like the door had been kicked in. Agard also stated that there was a new lock on the apartment door where Overby was staying.

Phone Contact with Schneidewend:

I was able to contact Schneidewend by phone, and he verbally identified himself to me. I identified myself as a police officer with the City of Madison Police Department. Schneidewend stated that he was on a temporary leave of absence and out in San Francisco for a few months, and he had found Overby, who accepted to stay in the apartment as somewhat of a subleaser. Schneidewend said he left his cat there, and Overby was also willing to watch the cat. Schneidewend said that on the day of this call, he received a letter in the mail from Overby which stated things along the lines of Overby not feeling safe in the apartment, that the downstairs tenants appeared to be working for the FBI and were surveiling him constantly. Schneidewend thought this letter was very weird and sounded very paranoid from Overby's perspective. Schneidewend stated due to this letter, he called police in order for Overby's welfare to be checked. Schneidewend did tell me that there shouldn't have been a new lock on the door, and Overby must have put the new lock on the door. Also in the letter that Schneidewend mentioned, Overby had stated that he was leaving the apartment because he didn't feel safe there and that he was taking Schneidewend's cat as well.

Upon my arrival, I could hear a cat in the apartment which made me think there was possibly an exigent circumstance to see if Overby was okay based on the letter and the cat still being there, since he mentioned in the letter he would be taking the cat when he left.

Schneidewend did give me the name of the landlord, who he identified as Ray Peterson.

Schneidewend also mentioned to me that Overby is a war veteran. Schneidewend also said Gary's been staying at the apartment for him as a subleaser since approximately last April or June of 2012.

I asked Schneidewend if he was technically still on the lease as the lease for the apartment, and he stated he was and that Overby was not on the lease and was just subletting and, therefore, Schneidewend was able to give permission for us to go in in case we needed to and felt that we needed to check Overby's welfare.

Attempt to Contact Ray Peterson:

I attempted to contact Ray Peterson by phone but was unsuccessful and left a message.

Contact with Neighbor Kathleen JO Bufton:

Officer Sarah Shimko was assisting at the scene, and she was able to talk with Bufton who lives directly below where Schneidewend's place is. Bufton had stated Overby drives a maroon Chevy Lumina with plates 111-RWG. Bufton stated she saw Overby a few days ago leave the residence and had not seen him since. Bufton did state he was in his vehicle and left.

It should be noted that upon arrival to the address, I did attempt to knock on the door and identified myself as Madison Police, but no one did answer after multiple attempts.

After getting the information from Bufton regarding Overby's car being gone and him not being in the house, I did not believe there was exigent circumstance but a guard asked us if we would stand by just as a precautionary measure because he did want to get Schneidewend's cat and make sure the cat's welfare was okay since we believed Overby would not be returning to the apartment. Although some concern did arise over Overby's welfare, we did not have exigency to go into the apartment and did not believe Overby was in there. We did stand by for a guard just for protection purposes, and he did ask to in case something suspicious did happen when he went in. A guard did get verbal permission from Schneidewend to enter the residence. A guard was able to make entrance into the apartment and retrieve the cat with nothing suspicious seen.

Contact was attempted with Green Cab to see if Overby had been working but they did not have any information.

NARRATIVE:

On 8/18/2013, I was working as 3D8 in the downtown Central area. At 7:45 PM, I received word of a fight that was occurring at 1125 Williamson St. Upon our arrival, we determined that the fight was already broken up. There was one woman who had a large bruise on the left side of her face. This was Melisa Harness. I did recognize Melisa Harness from prior police contacts. Melisa Harness appeared to be very intoxicated and I could smell intoxicants on her breath as I was crouched down, attempting to interview her. Melisa Harness kept repeating that she wanted to file charges against the people who had "jumped her." She was, however, unable to describe anyone who had "jumped her." Harness was transported by Madison Fire/Rescue unit to the UW Hospital emergency room. PO Rivera and Sgt Patton were on scene and identifying people who were at the rear of 1125 Williamson ST who apparently were involved in this disturbance.

I first spoke to a witness who stated that he had been across the street at the BP gas station and had observed the fight. This witness was Nick Zouski. Zouski stated he did not know any of the people involved and he described the three as a medium height woman wearing a blue shirt with dark hair and a lighter skinned smaller woman wearing a white t-shirt. He stated that there was also a heavier set male wearing a red t-shirt. Zouski stated that the woman wearing the white t-shirt was "with the guy and she was kind of pulling him along the sidewalk in front of 1125 Willy St. They were walking away from the other woman." Zouski described the other woman as the one wearing the blue t-shirt. He then added, "The woman wearing the blue t-shirt started following them."

I asked what happened next, and he stated that "then the guy goes behind the house and the two women look like they're having a heated argument for maybe one to two minutes. Then the guy comes out and then it looks like the blue t-shirt girl jumped on the guy."

I asked Zouski if he was certain that it was the woman wearing the blue t-shirt who had aggressed on the male. Zouski stated that it appeared to him that the male had not moved and that the woman wearing the blue t-shirt would have had to move towards him and then jumped on him.

Zouski was unable to provide me with any further information as to how the fight had ended. He stated the parties just seemed to separate on their own.

I next spoke to James Hatcher. James Hatcher identified himself as a friend of Melisa Harness. He stated specifically, "I was her boyfriend. I'm not sure if I still am, but I was." Hatcher stated that he and Melisa Harness had arrived together at 1125 Williamson St for a cookout. I did note that there was a grill with brats on in the back yard of 1125 Williamson St. Hatcher stated he himself had drank two beers. He stated that he was not certain how many beers or alcoholic beverages Harness had had, but admitted that she was very intoxicated.

I asked Hatcher to tell me what happened, and he stated, "Melissa went and got in Marilyn's face. I said Melisa, let's go, and I kind of pulled her along and then she actually got in the car, and I thought we were going to be able to leave, but then she got out of the car." I asked Hatcher to point out who was Marilyn, and he pointed to a very short, slender woman wearing a light colored t-shirt that could be a light gray or white. I asked him to continue. Hatcher stated, "Melisa grabbed hold of Marilyn's hair and Marilyn punched Melisa to get her to let go." Hatcher stated all of this had taken place on the driveway of 1125 Williamson St.

I next spoke to Corey Fillbach. Corey Fillbach admitted that he had heard some sort of disturbance in the driveway towards the front of 1125 Williamson St, but that he had not gone to investigate as he was concerned about cooking the brats on the grill. He then added, "I didn't see anything."

Kathy Bufton is the back yard. Kathy Bufton also insisted that she had not seen anything.

I next spoke to Marilyn Parker. Marilyn Parker stated that it had only been herself and Melisa Harness in front of 1125 Williamson St in the driveway. Marilyn Parker stated she did not know why Hamess had aggressed on her, but that Harness had and then grabbed onto her hair, causing her pain. Parker stated that Harness had continued to pull on her hair and that Parker had punched Harness once in the face in order to get her to let go. Parker stated that Melisa had let go and had stumbled away and fallen to the ground, but had then gotten back up. Parker stated that she had felt pain when Harness grabbed her hair and that she had not given Harness her consent to grab her hair.

Parker, however, stated that she did not want Harness arrested and she did not want to pursue a complaint regarding this matter. Parker stated that she just wanted Harness to leave her alone.

I did speak to everyone at the cookout at 1125 Williamson St separately. I did ask them if there was anyone else who was present at the fight who had left prior to the police getting there. I specifically asked if anyone had known a heavyset man wearing a red t-shirt who may have been involved in the fight and left prior to our arrival. Everyone I spoke to denied that there had been someone else involved who had left prior to police arrival. However, none of the people who were present matched the description that the witness Nick Zouski had provided.

I did speak to Sgt Patton on scene and advised him as to what I had learned after my interviews. I advised Sgt Patton that I did not believe I could arrest Harness for battery when Marilyn Parker was refusing to press charges. We did discuss the possibility of arresting Harness for disorderly conduct; however, the fight had taken place on private property and none of the people on the property had been disturbed by the fight.

I then left the scene to meet with Melisa Harness at the hospital. I did attempt to interview Harness again; however, she appeared to be very intoxicated and refused to cooperate with being interviewed. I did ask her if she was willing to have photographs taken of her bruise on her face, and she was unwilling to cooperate with that, either. As a consequence, I also was unable to get a release of medical information form completed by her. I did, however, make sure that she had my business card with the case number written on it and asked one of the nurses to include it in her property.

On 08/18/2013, I was dispatched to the area of 1133 Williamson St for a report of a fight in progress. PO Kenny and PO Christian arrived first. PO Kenny began interviewing the victim and I began interviewing a possible witness. PO Christian identified other possible witnesses which were later interviewed by PO Kenny and I. Please see PO Kenny's primary report.

I contacted Jordan Q. Fields a waiter at Cafe Costa Rica located next to where the fight occurred. Fields told me "Paige" another waitress at the restaurant alerted him to a possible fight outside the restaurant. Fields stated he went outside to see what was happening and saw a male subject standing over a female who was laying on the sidewalk. Fields stated the male was standing over the female, straddling her, while clenching his hands in a fist. Fields told me both subjects were between 1129 and 1125 Williamson St. Fields stated he overheard the female saying "You threw the first punch" and "You're going to jail now". Fields told me he told "Paige" to get him a phone and he called 9-1-1. Fields stated he believed the fight was going to start up again so he followed the subjects to a parking area behind 1125 Williamson St. Fields told me he stepped between both the male and the female subjects to keep them from fighting while he was speaking with 9-1-1. Fields described the male as Hispanic, 5'7" tall, heavy set with a "gut", red t-shirt, gray shorts, and blue ball cap. Fields stated he would be able to recognize the male subject if he saw him again, even if he changed clothes. PO Kenny and I had Fields observe two other subjects PO Kenny had identified, but stated neither were the male subject that was standing over the female.

I contacted Marilyn Parker who told me "I punched her". I asked what she meant by that and Parker told me she had punched the female subject known to her only as "Melissa". Parker stated she was sitting on the side porch of 1125 Williamson St. with her friend "Cat" talking. "Melissa" approached them, was very intoxicated, and began to interrupt their conversation which upset Parker. Parker stated several people in her group had already told "Melissa" to "Go away" several times. Parker told me she put her hand up palm facing "Melissa" as a non verbal gesture to be quiet. Parker stated she stood up and began to walk away; at which time, "Melissa" grabbed her by the hair and "dragged" her out to the sidewalk. Parker stated "Melissa" had now put a "choke" hold her which was impeding her breathing. Parker told me she elbowed "Melissa" in a front to back motion, which allowed Parker to get free. However, Parker stated both herself and "Melissa" fell to the ground. Parker told me she was then on top of "Melissa" straddling her. Parker stated "it happened so fast" and was unable to explain how she ended up on top of "Melissa". Parker told me "Melissa" was still attempting to scratch Parker using finger nails; Parker made a clawing motion to demonstrate what "Melissa" was doing. Parker told me at this point she punched "Melissa" twice in the right eye, with Parker's right closed fist. Parker showed me her hands and I did not see any physical evidence of a fight. Parker had no observable injuries to her face or neck. I ended my contact with Parker.

No further action at this time.

NARRATIVE:

On 09/08/2013, at approx. 9:11AM, P.O. Gray and I were dispatched to 1125 Williamson St. regarding an intoxicated person.

Upon arrival, we were directed to the backyard. We then contacted Joseph T. Dettweiler. Dettweiler was obviously intoxicated and was complaining of pain to his right shoulder. He began moving his shoulder around a little bit and said that it was feeling better. I asked him if he wanted an ambulance and he said that he was ok and did not need one.

He was able to walk and he was released. A little bit later I checked to see if he had any warrants and found that he had a warrant for his arrest through the Dept. of Corrections. P.O. Gray and I checked the area. We had last seen him near 1053 Williamson St. so we checked there. We found him in Apt. 3 there with a friend.

Upon contact, Dettweiler was cooperative and said that he needed an ambulance after all. He said that he had taken 4 morphine pills by grinding them up and snorting them. He also had been drinking. Medic 1 responded and conveyed him to UWER. I had not confirmed the warrant yet.

Upon arrival and examination at the UW Hospital, the physicians determined that he needed was a policy of not notifying law enforcement of the release of an individual. I advised the O.I.C. Lt. Bradley-Wilson as well as notifying the Dept. of Corrections.

On 02/01/14, I was working as 2D50 from 12 pm until 8 pm. I was dressed in full Madison Police Department military-style uniform and driving a fully-marked City of Madison squad car.

At approximately 1:18 pm, I was dispatched to Williamson Street, apartment reference a trespass complaint. Dispatch advised that Kathleen K Bufton (ID'd verbally) was reporting that there was a subject named "Virgil" D Julius (ID'd verbally), who was refusing to leave. Julius was described as a 50 year old Native American male wearing a black shirt.

Upon arrival, I made contact with Bufton and Julius. Julius claimed that he had been living with Bufton for "months" but was unable to show me any personal property in the residence. Julius also stated to me that he receives his mail at an Indian Reservation. While speaking with Julius, I noted that he was obviously intoxicated but not incapacitated.

I spoke with Bufton, who reported that she wanted Julius to leave and that he had only been staying with her for approximately one week. Bufton also was obviously intoxicated but not incapacitated.

Julius was escorted from the residence and told not to return. As I prepared to leave the area, I was advised that Julius had taken a key to the apartment with him when he had left. I retrieved the key from Julius and reminded him that he was not to return.

At approximately 6:02 pm, I was again dispatched to Williamson Street reference a welfare check. Dispatch advised that Jeffrey Geiger (ID'd verbally) was reporting that he had heard second hand information from Bufton that Julius had returned and that Julius was possibly holding Bufton against her will.

Upon arrival, I knocked on the door, and Julius eventually arrived and opened the door. I asked Julius for permission to enter the residence, and Julius consented. I began to enter the residence and heard Bufton yell at me from the other room that she did not want us inside of her residence. Officer Naylor, Officer Thompson, and I backed out of the residence, and I began to dialogue with Bufton from the door.

Eventually Bufton responded to the door and allowed us entry to the residence. Upon entering, I made contact with Bufton and contacted Julius. Bufton denied that there had been any physical altercation and that Julius had not held her against her will.

Bufton initially stated that she did not want Julius removed again; however, while I was speaking with Julius, Bufton told Officer Thompson that she wanted Julius removed. I placed Julius into handcuffs, which were double-locked and checked for fit. I then completed a search of Julius incident to lawful, custodial arrest.

Julius was escorted out of the residence and helped into the rear passenger seat of my squad car. I conveyed Julius to the Public Safety Building with Officer Thompson following. During the course of my conveyance, my in-car video was recording, and Julius was compliant. Upon our arrival at the Public Safety Building, Julius was helped into the booking area. I completed a Municipal Court Citation and Complaint (citation 133007; see attachment). A copy of this citation was placed into Julius's property and the citation was explained in full. I observed that Bufton had a very strong odor of intoxicants, swayed on her feet, and had very glassy and puffy eyes. I did advise Bufton to sit in a kitchen chair, and she complied.

Bufton told me that she had had contact with police earlier in the day. According to Bufton, Julius frequently comes over to her residence and forces her to let him in. Once Julius is at her residence, Bufton said that she drinks alcohol with Julius and then wants Julius to leave; however, Julius often refuses to leave. Bufton told me that last week this had also occurred. Bufton told me that she had to ask a friend to come over with a shovel in order to get Julius to leave. Bufton told me that she did not actually get the shovel and do this, but wanted to because she was frustrated with Julius staying at her residence longer than she wanted him to. Bufton told me that she does not like Julius very much, and does not consider him a friend. Bufton told me that she does not want Julius to return to her residence ever. Bufton stated, "I never want him to come back."

PO John Christian was conveying Julius, and I followed him to the Dane County Jail. I did assist in filling out the necessary paperwork, and that concluded my contact with Julius.

On February 15th, 2014, at approximately 1:27am, I was dispatched along with Officer Ron Alvarez to the 1100 block of Williamson St. We were dispatched to this area reference a caller who had spoken with our dispatcher for a long time with multiple hangups and a lot of confusion. The caller had given confused information and at points had been angry and had used profanities with the call taker. Eventually, the area of the 1100 block of Williamson St was determined to be where he was. The caller had originally complained that he had been attacked and was currently having a panic attack or something similar.

Officer Alvarez and I arrived into the area and began checking houses that could possibly be where the caller was. The caller stated to the call taker that he was hiding under a desk and was too afraid to leave where he was. This left us with no choice but to walk around looking at the houses to see if they matched the description of the house he claimed he was inside. He described a house that was dark green with a white porch on the front. Eventually, I checked 1125 Williamson St and could hear a man talking inside, possibly to our call taker. I knocked on the door and after speaking through the door with someone who was mumbling and confused, eventually the door was opened and I spoke with the man inside.

The caller was identified verbally as **DAREN L. WRASSE**. Wrasse had a difficult time explaining what was going on and why he had called the police. He stated that he was having a panic attack and suffered from the state of the

among other ailments. Wrasse stated that he was struck in the face by a "big black dude." I asked Wrasse if there was anyone else in the house and he was unable to give a coherent answer. Officer Alvarez and I checked the house and found that there were two other occupants inside, one of whom was **KATHLEEN J. BUFTON-DAVIS**. The other was **EZEKIEL GOLDEN**. Both were identified verbally. It should be noted that at the time, probable cause existed for Ezekiel Golden to be arrested on a completely separate incident. See case number 14-47648 for more information about that arrest and the ultimate disposition.

I then went back and spoke with Wrasse about what happened. It should be noted that Wrasse was intoxicated and had trouble focusing. It should also be noted that his symptoms of what he described as a panic attack were off and on. When Golden was escorted out of the house in handcuffs, Wrasse stopped shaking and covering his head so he could stick out his tongue and Golden and flip him off, saying to Golden, "Fuck you." After saying that without shaking or stuttering, he then resumed shaking, stuttering, and cowering a little. After Golden was placed in my squad car and I spoke to Wrasse, I made several attempts to get a coherent statement out of him. Ultimately, Wrasse told me that he came to this address at about 9:00pm and said he had some drinks. He said that some time later, he went to lie down in the living room area of the house where Golden approached him. Wrasse stated that Golden "out of the blue" approached him and began striking him in the face with his fist. Wrasse told me that he was hit multiple times, specifically in the mouth and that after a short time, Golden left. Wrasse told me that at that time, he did not feel the need to call police and told me that he wanted to "let bygones be bygones." He told me that after Golden punched him several times, he and Golden and Bufton-Davis drank and smoked together in the kitchen. He told me that after having drank and smoked with Golden and Bufton-Davis, Golden said something to him or yelled at him, which he states triggered his panic attack.

I checked Wrasse closely for injuries on his face and nose and found nothing to indicate that any sort of attack had occurred. There was no even the smallest mark on his face or inside of his nose or inside of his mouth.

I also spoke with Bufton-Davis about what had happened. Bufton-Davis told me that she was a witness and stated that "nothing happened." She told me that she believed Wrasse had too much to drink or was on some sort of drug or another and was simply acting foolishly. She told me that there was no confrontation, physical or verbal, between Wrasse and Golden.

Golden stated, "He's drunk," referring to Wrasse. He also stated that nothing happened between him and Wrasse.

It should be noted that after the incident, Bufton-Davis did not want Wrasse staying at her house. Wrasse collected his coat and shoes and left the area on foot. Wrasse stated that he did not want EMS for his panic attack and that he would walk to a friend's house who was only a couple of blocks away. He left without further incident.

As a result of the investigation, no charges were issued to Golden reference the Williamson St incident.

OFFICER NARRATIVE:

Initial Information

On February 18, 2014 I was on duty working for the City of Madison Police Department assigned as 3D8 in the Central District. I was wearing full department assigned uniform and operating marked squad #C1811.

At approximately 5:29pm I was dispatched to 1125 E. Wilson St. in the City of Madison for a trespass complaint. Information provided in the call advised that a female who identified herself as "Jennifer" said, "I'm going to need some help over here," and then disconnected. Upon Dispatch calling back, the caller said that she was there with her sister and brother, but kept hanging up on the dispatcher several times when she tried obtaining the address. At one point, the caller told the dispatcher that she as in Milwaukee, but then gave the address of 1125 E. Wilson, Madison. The caller also claimed that it was an accidental dial and that there was no emergency.

Dispatch advised me that the same phone number had called 911 on January 28, 2014 using the address of 1125 Williamson Street and a check in LERMS indicated that the phone number belonged to an Abigale Julius.

Officers' Actions

I responded to 1125 E. Wilson and noted that this was not a valid address, PO Engler and I then responded to 1125 Williamson Street and knocked on the doors to the several units of this residence. Upon going to the rear of the residence, I could hear a female calling to us after hearing us knocking. This female was identified verbally as Kathleen J. Bufton and advised that she resides there. Bufton invited us to come inside

Once inside, contact was made with another female named Abigale D. Julius. I verified that they were the only two there and that there was no "Jennifer" there. Bufton said to me that Julius was the one who called 911. Bufton appeared to be very intoxicated and would go from agitated to cooperative repeatedly.

I contacted Julius and identified her with a Wisconsin ID Card. Julius told me that she did call 911, but it was just an accident. Then Julius said that she was trying to call someone with a 715 area code and she just made a mistake. I began to ask Julius about why she refused to give the address if it was an honest mistake and also why she had said to the dispatcher, "I'm going to need some help over here." Bufton kept interrupting the interview, despite being told to stop. Bufton at one point said that there was a problem person there, but he left. Julius admitted that she lied to the dispatcher about saying she was in Milwaukee and did hang up repeatedly, but stated she told the dispatcher that the person left. It should be noted that no info was received from the dispatcher about a person leaving.

I began asking Julius about the person who was there causing a problem and she told me that his name was "David" and she didn't know anything else about him because he was Kathleen's friend. I separately interviewed Bufton about the male and Bufton told me that the male who was there was Julius' brother who is also Bufton's boyfriend. Bufton provided his name of Virgil Julius.

I went back to Julius and she admitted that she had lied to me saying, "I know, I heard (Bufton telling me the truth)." Julius was then advised that she was being arrested for Obstructing an Officer because she had provided false information about accidentally calling 911 and also about the identity of the third person who was there causing problems for which she had actually called 911. It was explained to Julius that she would go out to the squad car and receive a citation. Julius was cooperative and after being issued her citation she was given a conveyance to the Salvation Army shelter at 630 E. Washington Ave.

The citation was personally served and the conveyance occurred without incident.

OFFICER NARRATIVE

INITIAL INFORMATION

On 2/20/14, I was wearing full MPD military-style uniform and operating marked squad C537. At approximately 6:02 PM, I was dispatched along with Officer Matt Kenny and Officer Chris Doman to a physical domestic in which the female victim had been strangled at 1125 Williamson Street Dispatch indicated that all parties involved were on scene, but the disturbance was no longer ongoing. I did proceed to that location in an expedited fashion in the event that further violence would ensue.

ARRIVAL ON SCENE

Upon arriving at this residence, I did proceed through the open door leading through the screened in porch. The door was also open to the residence, and I did observe a white male seated immediately within the door. I identified this individual as Paul D. Hirschey who stated he was a roommate of Kathleen J. Bufton-Davis. Paul told me that Kathleen and her friend "Virgil" had left the house promptly after calling 911. He stated that he observed a large bruise on Kathleen's cheek that had not been there earlier in the day. Paul told me, however, that he had not heard any disturbance in Kathleen's room prior to her phone call to the police.

He stated that she has had a "string of unsavory characters" in and out of the apartment ever since she moved in three years ago. Paul said that he is very concerned for Kathleen's well being, as she does not seem to surround herself with good people. He also informed me that she is very frequently intoxicated and does tend to become combative with police when in this state. Paul said that Kathleen lives in the apartment and that Edward Greengrass does not reside there. I provided Paul with my card and a case number and urged him to call me if any further disturbances occurred or if he had concern for Kathleen's welfare.

CONTACT WITH EDWARD GREENGRASS

Upon entering Kathleen's bedroom, I made contact with a Native American male who verbally identified himself to me as Edward Greengrass. I am familiar with Edward due to past professional contacts, and I am aware that he has a long criminal history, in addition to domestic incidents with Kathleen. I detected an odor of intoxicants emanating from his person, and his speech was somewhat slow. There were a number of beer cans surrounding Edward, and he admitted to drinking "a couple" of beers. I determined that he was not incapacitated by alcohol through my contact with him.

Edward said that he and Kathleen formerly resided together the year prior for approximately three months. He told me that they have been in a dating relationship for about three years and that they were engaged. Edward stated to me that "nothing had happened" and that he was unsure as to why Kathleen called the police that evening. He said that he had purchased some beer and snacks and brought them to Kathleen's apartment. Edward told me that they had been spending time together and that everything was alright until "Virgil" arrived. He stated that at that time, Kathleen asked Edward to leave the apartment. Edward told me that this was due to the

fact that "Virgil" is jealous of Edward's relationship with Kathleen. When I asked Edward what "Virgil's" relationship with Kathy was, he advised that they were dating each other. Although I advised Edward that this did not make sense to me, he continued to insist that he had no problem with Kathleen dating "Virgil" while engaged to him.

Edward said that when Kathleen asked him to leave, she took his beer, and he refused to leave until she handed it to him. He stated that she continued to maintain possession of the beer and asked him to leave once more. Edward told me that after about five minutes of Kathleen asking him to leave, she called the police and requested their assistance. He said that he knew he hadn't done anything wrong, so he sat down on Kathleen's bed and awaited police arrival. Edward said that Kathleen and "Virgil" ran from the apartment, because, "Virgil is a rapist." I asked Edward if he believed "Virgil" to have a warrant; he said that I should have that information. He was unable to provide me with "Virgil's" last name nor contact information. I did examine Edwards hands due to the information related to the bruise on Kathleen's face and located no marks of any kind.

As I did not have a complainant on scene and Paul was unaware of this disturbance, I did not cite Edward and escorted him from the residence. I advised him not to return and told him that this was his official notification. I told Edward that he would be cited for trespass if he returned.

FOLLOW UP

I did return to 1125 Williamson Street on 2/21/14 in order to attempt contact with Kathleen but was unable to do so. I spoke with her roommate, Paul, once more, and he advised that Kathleen wanted to make a report to police. He told me that she was at the bar drinking and that she is extremely uncooperative with police when intoxicated. I advised him to call me when she returned to the apartment and was willing to speak with police. Paul once more expressed concern over her well being due to her associations with these "unsavory" characters.

I will attempt contact with Kathleen on 2/23/14 if possible.
