Re: Electronic waste collected during student move out period

You are receiving this letter because you have been identified as owning rental property in the region considered to be the student apartment area of Madison. A map of the student apartment area in question is enclosed. If you do not own rental property in the area indicated on the map you may disregard this notice and we apologize for the error.

The annual move out period in the student apartment area in August presents numerous challenges for property owners, residents/renters, and City employees. These challenges are particularly daunting for the Streets Division, who is tasked with collecting substantial amounts of trash and recycling that accumulate in the right-of-way in a short period of time.

Due to the size and scope of the annual student move out, this letter serves as notice for owners of rental properties within the student move area indicated on the enclosed map, pursuant to Wis. Stat. Sec. 66.0628(2m), that if any televisions, monitors, laptops, or computers are placed to the curb in front of your property contrary to Madison General Ordinance 10.18(13) during the yearly student move out period, that the Streets Division shall cause these items to be removed and disposed of properly.

The student move period for 2020 begins August 2 and will continue until close of business September 4.

If a television, monitor, or computer is collected from the curb at a property you own in the student apartment area of Madison as indicated on the enclosed map during the student move period, your property will thereafter be charged the required recycling fee plus an additional \$30 administrative fee for each item collected.

Under Madison General Ordinances Sec. 10.18(13), no televisions, computer monitors, laptop or desktop computers, or CPUs may be placed or kept on any terrace or curbside for collection by the City and must, instead, be disposed of at an authorized recycling site or other lawful manner. Moreover, every property owner is responsible for maintaining their property in accordance with this requirement.

Televisions and monitors contain hazardous material such as lead and mercury. Computers can hold sensitive data and rare earth metals. During the yearly student move out period, when these kind of items have been set to the curb they have ended up broken, creating hazards in the right-of-way and

allowing harmful materials to enter the City's storm drains. In order for them to be safely recycled, they must be taken to a Streets Division drop-off site or to another reputable private recycler.

How to Help

Please contact your tenants to be sure they are aware of their responsibilities during the move out process, and how they can safely recycle these electronics and other items.

How to Recycle Televisions and Other Electronics with the City of Madison

The City offers two drop-off sites for recycling of electronics. The sites are located at 1501 W. Badger Rd. and 4602 Sycamore Ave.

For Madison residents and taxpayers to recycle televisions, computers, monitors, and laptops at these sites, they must purchase a recycling fee sticker. Stickers may be purchased online at www.madisonpay.com or over the phone. They will be mailed out following a successful purchase. Allow for at least one week for delivery. Stickers are not available for purchase at the drop-off sites.


