Audible Pedestrian Signal Request

The City of Madison will consider the installation of accessible pedestrian traffic signals (APS) to provide crossing assistance at signalized intersections, but only where needed. To be considered for APS, the location must first meet the following basic criteria:

1. The intersection must already be signalized.
2. There must be a demonstrated need for an APS. The need is demonstrated through this user request.
3. The location should have unique characteristics (i.e.; a unique intersection configuration).

Traffic Engineering will evaluate these requests considering the safety and effectiveness of the crossing for pedestrians in general, as well as the information needs of pedestrians with visual disabilities. A number of factors may be reviewed in determining whether or not to install an audible signal, including, but not limited to, traffic volumes (including turning traffic); proximity to key destinations; intersection complexity; traffic signal phasing; and frequency of use of the crossing by people with visual disabilities.
