Net Present Value of 50-Year Equipment Replacement & Repairs	\$3.8M	\$3.8M
50-Year Lifecycle Cost	\$12.4M	\$12.8M

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

- Option 2 is more desirable from a social and environmental impact perspective
- **Option 1** is more desirable from a purely financial perspective
- Staff recommends Option 2 since the minimal additional cost more than compensates for the greater social and environmental benefits
